Our final "Learn To Shoot" clinic of this year will be held this Thursday, 14 April at 9:00AM. These events are the most labor intensive events we host and we need at a minimum 18 club members to volunteer for each clinic. I'll pass around a

At our May Meeting we will plan for these activities, which are completely sold-out every time.

I spoke with Allison Fussell from The Villages Middle School Buffalo Adventures after school programs about our archery classes and the drop in enrollment we are experiencing. She said all the programs are experiencing a drop in enrollment this past year but that it might be due to more programs being offered and competing interests. She thinks that the fact that we don't offer archery for the entire school year, could be hurting our enrollment. Since many of our club members who help run this program are snowbirds and do not return to The Villages until January, it may be impossible for us to offer the classes during the September–December period. Discussion followed.

Gerry Stocker, Ken Hamann, et.al., have been working on plans for a new design in our target stands. A new design has been developed and a prototype will be built to test out the design. Our intent is to replace all of the existing target stands on the range with newly designed stands that will be easier to move around and less susceptible to being hit by errant arrows. The new stands will be built next winter. Ken gave an update on this project.

We had a very successful work party last Thursday and we replaced many badly shot-up target cores with new cores. You should be advised that these new cores will be "tight" and it will be more difficult to remove your arrows for a while until they loosen up. Be sure to lube your arrows before shooting to make removal easier. The club has purchased several bottles of "WOODY'S" and they are available for \$10 a bottle at the club house. See a club officer if you want to purchase one.

We have eight (8) new cores that are so tight that you can't get your arrows out of them. Thanks to Tracy Whitten's help, we will get free replacement of these cores from Whitetail Archery. The new cores are in the process of being shipped. We can keep the old "new" cores and use them as back-up cores.

Ken Woolley, gave a status report on the medal order that was placed last month?

The Club Library is a very extensive collection of Archery books, CD, and video tapes that are available to all club members. Bruce Hansen is our club Librarian and he will be happy to check out any of this material to you to take home and enjoy.

As a reminder, the Only way you can join the Archery Club or renew your dues is at a club meeting. Dues for new members are \$25. Dues for members who renew their membership will be \$10. As a reminder, if you move a target in any of the target positions from 1 through 12, it is your responsibility to return the target to its standard position before you leave the range. The standard positions are as follows:

Targets 1 - 3 are set at 60 yards
Targets 4 – 6 are set at 50 yards
Targets 7 – 9 are set a 40 yards
