As a reminder, if you move a target in any of the target positions from #1 through #9, it is your responsibility to return the target to its standard position before you leave the range. The standard positions are as follows:

- a. Targets 1 - 3 are set at 60 yards
- b. Targets 4 - 6 are set at 50 yards
- c. Targets 7 - 9 are set at 40 yards
