Old Business:

Willy Kuecker discussed the incident that happened at our last tournament where one of the teams had a coach which may or may not have been legal depending on which sanctioning body the tournament was held under.

We had a total of 47 shooters at the Classic 900 Round Tournament we hosted on 4 May Thanks to everyone who worked the tournament.

The new target cores are in and are currently in the target room. The plan is to store them in the old bathroom as soon as arrangements for the room can be made.

The electronic deadbolt lock on the archery room door malfunctioned and it was necessary to have a lock smith drill the lock out in order to remove it. A new lock, with the same combination has been installed. Once we take possession of the old bathroom, the additional electronic lock will be installed with the same combination as the archery room.

Blair went back over our shoots back to 2011 to try and determine if there was any difference from having shoots on Saturday and Sunday. We had 8 shoots on Saturdays and 12 Shoots on Sunday. The average of shooters on Saturday was 36.25 and the average on Sundays was 35.25. Basically no difference from Saturday to Sunday.

Before this shoot, we will need a work party to do some work on our targets. We need to replace some cores. I would like to schedule that work party for Thursday, 12 June, at 9:00AM.

Camp Villages will begin on June 19. We will also have another camp Villages on July 10 which will be before the July meeting. Charlie was doing some checking on the Camp Villages schedule and he found a big problem. I have sent an e-mail to Blair that he needs to contact Dillon ASAP to iron out the problem. We are going to need people to help with both programs to sign up tonight. We will need at least 18 people to help staff this Villages program. I will pass around a sheet for you sign up to help with the program. Again this year it will be a morning only program starting at 9 but the volunteers need to be at the range by 7:30 to set the range up. Again this year the club will provide lunch for all the volunteers. I would like to ask for someone to help get the food. We will ask for volunteers at next month's meeting on 9 June.

Last month we voted to assemble a first aid kit for the archery room. The kit is in place and is located in the plastic bin up and to the left of the entrance door of the archery room. The kit contains everything for minor scrapes to fairly major injury. Eye wash, bandages, compresses as well as first aid tools for splinter removal and the like are in the kit. If there is a major incident the kit is just meant to give aid until the ambulance arrives.

Blair has asked me to order several chest protectors for club. Are there any other items that you feel we need to include with that order?

The ONLY arrows that should be used are the ones in the arrow box located on the left side of the shop, as you enter the door.

The arrow saw was damaged from improper use. Norm repaired the unit and will do a hands on demonstration at the end of the meeting.
