### New Cores and Matts

All 17 cores at Paradise will be replaced sometime in September along with the five worst butts. The range will be closed on the scheduled day.

In order to try to maximize and prolong the life of the targets at Paradise, it has been proposed to reverse the yardages mid year as follows:

Lanes 1-9 set at 10 & 20 yards

Lanes 10-17 set at 40, 50, 60 yards

This should even out the wear. Meeting attendees seemed to think this was a good idea

### Targets

If practicing on target face other than what's currently on target, Please Do Not put your practice target face on top of current target face and damage 2 target faces. Drop it down or remove it until you're done practicing.

If you can shoot tight groups PLEASE shoot different targets each time at the range

Each Monday morning (at Paradise) we rotate target faces from 12 o'clock (first Monday of month), to 3 o'clock, to 6, to 9.

PLEASE when you come to the range abide by the target face position on Lanes 1-9. KEEP THEM WHERE THEY ARE

If you move a target to a different yardage, PLEASE return it to the yardage label on the column on the shooting lane. Remember – Archery 101 requires the

instructors to move Targets to 10 yard line – Help the instructors by moving the targets back to the correct position.

### **Paradise Shop Tool Usage**

There have been some issues regarding missing hand tools at Paradise. The Club has tried to provide a good selection of tools for members to use while tuning their equipment. In the past, tools have been replaced when they disappear. It is getting to the point that even newly purchased tools are disappearing. We are considering not replacing any missing tools and encouraging members to bring their own hand tools to work on their equipment.

Missing tools include Bitzenberger fletching jigs, bow tuning tools, allen wrenches, etc. Many of these tools are kept in the secured space beneath the bench and are still missing. If anyone has another suggestion on how we can provide tools to members and keep them secured please let us know.

Equipment such as the bow presses, string jig, metal detectors, etc will remain available for members to use.
