We need to plan for the June activity tonight, since we will not have another meeting before that event. I will pass around a volunteer sign-up sheet and ask everyone who can to sign up to come out and help.

Gery Stocker, Ken Hamann, et.al., have been working on plans for a new design in our target stands. A new design has been developed and a prototype has been built and is sitting at the range on shooting position #8.. Our intent is to replace all of the existing target stands on the range with newly designed stands that will be easier to move around and less susceptible to being hit by errant arrows. The new stands will be built next winter.

We have received the eight new “Replacement Cores” from American Whitetail and those cores are now in our Target Room. We received these cores free of charge, except shipping, to replace previous cores which we could not use because you could not pull the arrows out of them they were so firm.

We have received the new order of 500 medals. We now have enough medals to last us for two or three years.

It has been suggested that we replace our “old” compound bows with new Genesis Gen X bows. These bows are adjustable between 25-40 pounds, which is more draw weight than is available in our current Genesis bows. I would propose that we buy four of these bows. They will cost approximately \$150 each.

Mary Ann’s husband, Bill, passes away last week and the club has made a \$50 donation to The Villages Hospice in his honor.

The Club Library is a very extensive collection of Archery books, CD, and video tapes that are available to all club members. Bruce Hansen is our club Librarian and he will be happy to check out any of this material to you to take home and enjoy. Jim Rosenmeyer will coordinate the library for June and July.

As a reminder, the only way you can join the Archery Club or renew your dues is at a club meeting. Dues for new members are \$25. Dues for members who renew their membership will be \$10. We do not accept payment given to other persons or mailed in. You must be present at a meeting to pay your dues.

As many of you know, we have yellow club shirts that we wear at club events or when we participate in competitions. The club logos are done on our shirts by Custom Apperal, which is located in the Southern Trace Shopping Center. We also have Club Hat available.

As a reminder, if you move a target in any of the target positions from 1 through 12, it is your responsibility to return the target to its standard position before you leave the range. The standard positions are as follows:

Targets 1 - 3 are set at 60 yards  
Targets 4 – 6 are set at 50 yards  
Targets 7 – 9 are set a 40 yards
