# **The Villages Archery Club**

## Meeting Minutes March 11, 2024

Opened the meeting with Welcome and Pledge of Allegiance. Approximately 47 members in attendance.

Three new members/guests introduced themselves.

## Old Business:

- The CPR/AED training is scheduled for 5:30 p.m., April 8 at Rohan. The training will be in lieu of the regular Club meeting. The training group can handle up to 50 people. An email will be sent out with instructions on how to register for the training.
- Paul thanked all of the club members who volunteered to support The Villages Outdoor Expo, especially John Gauger and MaryAnn Hartman who covered an extra shift when a couple people couldn't show up.
- The Villages Discovery Series will hold an archery event March 26 from 1:00 to 2:50 at the Dudley range. It is expected that the volume of Villagers participating in this even will be high, so a lot of lane coaches are needed. Also, the Dudley range will be closed to normal use at that time.
- The Public Relations Director position remains open.

## **Officer Reports:**

- Secretary: We currently have about 192 members, including a couple that joined at this meeting. Mary also conducted a website demonstration to show where the RSVP, Meeting Minutes and Email history are available.
- **Paradise Range:** Sunny said that the damaged boot brush/scraper is being looked at and discussed with the Rec Center. She also reminded everyone that if they have any issues or suggestions regarding the Paradise range, they should contact her, not the Rec Center directly.
- **Dudley Range:** Kevin stated that signs were posted reminding everyone to return targets to 20 yards, and that, in general, archers are doing a better job returning the targets. He also mentioned that several cores have been replaced and that several targets need foaming, which will take them out of service for a few days.
- Tournaments:
  - Mike Sellers announced that he is working with the Silver Springs Archery Club to put together a 3D league. He stated that league fees would be \$10 and range fees would also be \$10 per session, unless you joined the Silver Springs club for \$100 a year. More information is forthcoming.
  - Mike also stated that he was investigating facilities for indoor shooting, especially for the hot summer days, and cold winter days. So far, a suitable location has not been located.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Paul provided the results from the March 9-10 tournaments:

- March 9 Polk County Senior Games: MaryAnn Hartman, John Gauguer, and Rick Aaron participated. MaryAnn and John placed first in their divisions, and Rick placed third in his division.
- March 9-10 NFAA Indoor State and Sectional Championships: Dave Van Nice and Paul Nesbitt participated and both finished second place in their divisions in both the State and the SE region.
- Reminder that the Club will be holding a Lake of the Woods tournament on March 16 at 9:00 a.m. There will be two formats for this tournament: Traditional 10 targets, at 5 yard intervals, from 20-65 yards, and Intermediate 5 targets, at 5 yard intervals, from 20-40 yards. Target face sizes are adjusted based on the distance. More info has been sent in an email to the club membership, and the RSVP is still open on website.

## • Fun Shoots:

Jerry Engel stated that the March 9 Fun Shoot, held at Dudley, went very well and there were 24 shooters. Jerry reminded everyone that the next Fun Shoot is 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 13, at the Paradise range. The theme will be Easter, and targets will be progressional with targets at longer distances for compound shooters.

### • Leagues:

 Donna announced the winners of both the 600 League and the Mini-600 League. She also said that there has been a good response to the Spring League RSVP and that more information will be coming soon regarding the exact format and instructions for establishing handicaps.

## • Social Committee:

- Rachel Burge reminded everyone that the next Social event will be a pot-luck immediately following the April 13 Fun Shoot. She also mentioned that we will also be holding a Senior Games warm-up 600 tournament later that day for those interested.
- **Treasury:** Jim reviewed the January 2024 financials (see below for Presentation material).

"Lake of the Woods" Tournament Format

Note: Format is based on NFAA Rules

### Full Tournament

- 1) !0 Targets
  - a. 20/25/30 yds FITA **40cm** 5 color target face
  - b. 35/40/45/50 yds FITA **60cm** 5 color target face
  - c. 55/60/65 yds FITA **80cm** 5 color target face
- 2) 3 arrows per end MAX score each end "30" Max score per round "300"
- 3) Shooters will shoot  $\mathbf{2}$  rounds with a 10-minute time out after the first round.
- 4) Each Archer will be assigned starting shooting lane (i.e. 1,2,3.....) up to lane "10" at the completion of each end & after scoring archers will advance to the next shooting land/distance in order (ie. If you START on lane 3 your next end will be shoot on lane 4 etc.)
  - a. At the start of the match there will be 2 PRACTICE ends at your initially assigned lane!!
  - b. After the 2 practice ends SCORING will begin at your initially assigned lane. There will be NO practice ends after ½ time!!
- 5) After 1/2 time you will start your 2<sup>nd</sup> round on you initially assigned lane
- 6) The Paradise Facility shall be laid out as shown in Fig A



### Intermediate Tournament

- 1) 5 targets
  - a. 20/25/30 yds FITA **40cm** 5 color target
  - b. 35/40 yds FITA **60CM** 5 color target
- 2) 3 arrows per end MAX score each end "30" MAX score each round "150"
- 3) Shooters will shoot  $\mathbf{4}$  rounds with a 10-minute time out after the 2<sup>nd</sup> round.
- 4) Each Archer shall be assigned a shooting lane starting at lane 12 thru 16 (Note Lanes 11 & 17 will not be shot) at the completion of each end the archer will advance to the nest shooting lane from land 12 thru 16(i.e., If you start on lane 13 your next lane will be 14 etc.)
  - a. At the start of the match there will be 2 PRACTICE ends at your initially assigned lane!!
  - b. After the 2 practice ends SCORING will begin at your initially assigned lane. There will be NO practice ends after ½ time!!
- 5) After ½ time you will start your 2<sup>nd</sup> half (i.e. 3 round) at your initially assigned lane
- 6) See Fig A for the range layout.

**NOTE:** 2 Archers per lane per end. If more then 20 archers register for full tournament OR more then 10 archers register for the Youth/Short Distance tournament then shooting will be have an "A" & "B" line, alternating A/B-B/A first up.

- The Dreaded <u>"TP"</u>
  - $_{\rm O}\,$  What are you really afraid of
  - $\,\circ\,$  Demystifying & Working with it
- Surprise Shot vs Punching vs Controlled Shooting (don't confuse with Command Shot)

- Practice **<u>YOUR</u>** Game
- Restrain from Imitating/Copying Others
- Remember: 99% of the time it's not the equipment
- Periodic Shot Evaluation
