During the summer, Ken Hamann built a new "Record Holder" board for the club. He will bring this board with him when he returns to the Villages in January. He has asked where we want to put this board? Here is a picture of the board.

We are finishing up the 1<sup>st</sup> Term of archery classes with The Villages Middle School. The 2<sup>nd</sup> term will begin this week. We meet every Thursday afternoon at the field across from Buffalo Glen softball Complex at 3:00 to 4:30PM. We need more help, so please come out and give us a hand. The club gets paid about \$45 for each student in the program each term. This past term the club will have made about \$1,000 after expenses. These funds go right into our club treasury.

Currently, we have the following quantities of Medals:

Bronze ... 180

We should be ordering more Gold and Silver medals. Each year we give away from 100-150 Gold Medals and about 75 Silver Medals. We will need to order more medals around March of next year.

The Club has elected to continue to have the Monday morning shoots at 9am after daylight savings time begins next month.

2018 dues renewals will begin to be collected at the November meeting.

The next few months we can expect to see a big increase in people at our meetings and at the range as the snowbirds return. Our "activity / tournament" schedule will become much busier with all the things the club does during the winter months. Are there any particular things you would like to see us do in our meetings / activities this winter that we may not have done in the past?

The social committee will soon begin the refreshments and social get together after the meetings. They will also take on the task of sending "Get Well" and "Sympathy" cards for members/families.

We are asking everyone to pick-up trash that is left around the range such as old targets, plastic water bottles, etc.

Ken Woolley has purchased Club pins and they are available for \$1.00 each. Ken, show us the pins.

The Club Library is a very extensive collection of Archery books, CD, and video tapes that are available to all club members. Jim Murray is our club Librarian and he will be happy to check out any of this material to you to take home and enjoy.

As a reminder, the only way you can join the Archery Club or renew your dues is at a club meeting. Dues for new members are \$25. Dues for members who renew their membership will be \$10. We do not accept payment given to other persons or mailed in. You must be present at a meeting to pay your dues.

As many of you know, we have yellow club shirts that we wear at club events or when we participate in competitions. The club logos are done on our shirts by Custom Apparel, which is located in the Southern Trace Shopping Center. We also have Club Hat available.

As a reminder, if you move a target in any of the target positions from 1 through 12, it is your responsibility to return the target to its standard position before you leave the range. The standard positions are as follows:

Targets 1 - 3 are set at 60 yards  
Targets 4 – 6 are set at 50 yards  
Targets 7 – 9 are set a 40 yards
