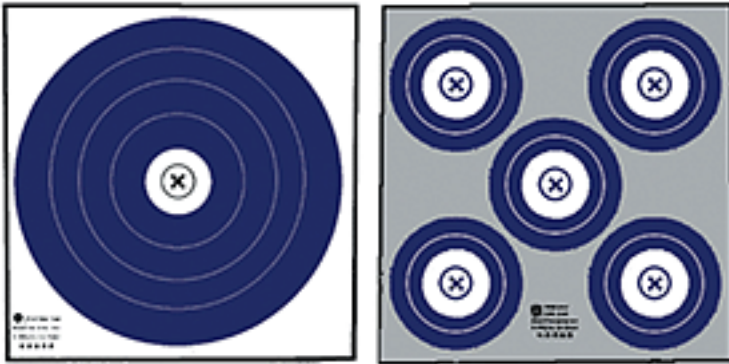


Tournament Descriptions

300 Round

The 300 format consists of 12 ends of 5 (*60 total*) arrows at 20 yards using the NFAA blue and white indoor target face. There are 2 versions of that target face, usually printed on opposite sides of the same target:



- The first is the “1-spot”, consisting of 5 rings with values of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 point. Arrows outside the 1-ring count as a miss (0 points).
- The second is the “5-spot”, consisting of 5 targets with a 5-ring and a 4-ring. Arrows outside the 4-ring count as a miss. The 5-spot is generally preferred by compound bow shooters more concerned about jamming 5 arrows in a small space than with the possibility of shooting outside the 4-ring.

600 Round

The 600 Round is a medium to long-distance competition. It is shot over three separate distances (60, 50 & 40 yards). It consists of sixty total arrows (*12 ends of 5*), twenty (*4 ends*) shot at each distance, each worth a maximum of ten points. The maximum score is $10 \times 60 = 600$ points, which is where the name of the round is derived. It will use the 122 cm target shown here:



600 Round Classic

The 600 Classic format is the same as a 600, however, shot in reverse (40, 50, & 60 yards). It will use the 122 cm target shown here:



720 Round

The 720 Round is a long-distance competition. It is shot at 50 meters (54.68 yards). It consists of seventy-two total arrows each worth a maximum of ten points. The maximum score is $10 \times 72 = 720$ points, which is where the name of the round is derived. It will use the 122 cm target shown here:



900 Round *(including Villages Senior Games)*

The 900 Round is a long to medium-distance competition. It is shot over three separate distances (60, 50 & 40 yards). It consists of ninety total arrows, thirty at each distance, each worth a maximum of ten points. The maximum score is $10 \times 90 = 900$ points, which is where the name of the round is derived. It will use the 122 cm target shown here:



Lake of the Woods *(designed by a club member)*

The Lake of the Woods will be offered in two formats:

1) Traditional format: 10 targets, at 5-yard increments from 20 to 65 yards. Target faces change based on the distance and each end is 3 arrows. We will go through the course twice, for a total of 60 arrows.

2) Intermediate format: 5 targets, at 5-yard increments from 20-40 yards. Target faces change based on distance and each end is 3 arrows. We will go through this set of targets a total of 4 times.

Double Vegas

The Vegas format consists of 10 ends of 3 arrows *(30 total)* at 20 yards. Double means it is shot twice *(60 total arrows)*. It will use a 40 cm target shown here:
